Mong Marma is an Indigenous advocate from the Chittagong Hills Tracts in Bangladesh. He became an activist as a student in Bangladesh – advocating for the rights of Indigenous peoples in the conflict area of the Chittagong Hill Tracts in Bangladesh. In 2005 Mong won a scholarship to attend Southern Cross University in Australia. Subsequently from 2008-2009, Mong interned with DTP and participated in DTP’s programs in Sydney and Canberra. He was then recruited by Peace Brigades International to do frontline human rights and peacebuilding work in Nepal and in the ceasefire areas in Mindanao. He was then recruited to be Human Rights Program Officer with the Asia Indigenous Peoples Pact in Thailand, before being accepted on a Rotary Peace Fellowship to do a Masters in Peace and Conflict Studies at University of Queensland. His research will focus on Myanmar and on community based approaches to conflict resolution.
